Introduction

Established in 1956, the Shanghai University of Traditional Chinese Medicine (SHUTCM) was one of the first four TCM colleges across China. The University is located within the Zhangjiang Hi-Tech Park and Shanghai Free Trade Zone. Today, the University alumni are living in over 100 countries or territories. Jointly supported by the Ministry of Education and Shanghai Municipal Government, the University is included in the construction projects for national “First-Class Discipline” and High-Level Universities in Shanghai. SHUTCM has over 700 experts and professors, 3 academicians, 2 National Medical Master, 1 prestigious teacher of National Higher Education Institution, 76 mentors for the “National Workshop to Inherit Academic Experience of Senior Chinese Medical Doctors” and 64 municipal-celebrated TCM doctors. In 1999 and 2007, the University was twice awarded the “Excellence in Undergraduate Education” by the Ministry of Education. In 2017, the programs of Traditional Chinese Medicine and Chinese Materia Medica were selected in the National Initiative for Developing Top-notch Programs. In the recent evaluation conducted by the Ministry of Education, 3 programs including TCM, Chinese Materia Medica and Integrative Chinese and Western Medicine were graded A+.

There are more than 7,000 full-time students, and more than 15% are degree students. The University is cooperating with several world-class universities, and has set up 10 international centers of traditional Chinese medicine. The first Confucius Institute of Traditional Chinese Medicine is set up in the United States.

Type of class

Admission prerequisites

- High school graduation or above
- Requirements for English language
 - (a) Studied courses taught in English language and transcripts required
 - (b) >90 of TOEFL or >6 of IELTS (non-native English speakers)

Tuition fees

- 450 RMB per person for application
- 42,000 RMB per year for tuition
- Purchase fee for textbooks
- Accommodation Fee
- Live on campus: Please see Introduction of International Student's Dormitory (Attachment 2). Notice of the accommodation arrangement will be sent out in middle July. (The accommodation fee may fluctuate).
- Live off-campus: Students can live off-campus upon approval by the University and pay on themselves.

Extra notice might be given to applicants who are required to provide individual financial documents. Supplementary documents can be uploaded under the item "Additional Materials" (see the online application webpage.)

Qualified applicants will receive admission letters and Visa Application Form for Study in China (JW202 form) from SHUTCM.

- Students voluntarily withdraw
